# **Program Topics**

#### MANAGERIAL ACCOUNTING (10 HOURS)

This course introduces accounting as an information system, introduces/discusses financial accounting as the system that accountants use to communicate information to external users; and introduces/discusses managerial accounting as the system of information that internal users (managers) employ for decision making.

#### **ACCOUNTING CASE ANALYSIS (10 HOURS)**

This course further develops the student's understanding of accrual accounting, the goals, and objectives of financial reporting, the information needs of end-users, the qualities of useful information, as well as the financial statements and financial statement elements.

## **TA-LED DISCUSSION SESSIONS (10 HOURS)**

A UIUC graduate student will lead discussions and answer questions during reading week and seminar week. Readings and discussions will further the students' knowledge and understanding of the course content.

# **Co-Curricular Sessions (2 HOURS)**

Enriching students' experiences by providing interactive resources for planning their overseas U.S. education.

- Q&A with PhD student: graduate applications & research skills; writing academic research reports
- Graduate College: how to be a successful graduate student
- Career Services: intercultural communication and personal branding
